BURLINGTON UPDATE WE'RE JUST GETTING STARTED! PHASE 3 – VERMONT ADAPTIVE ON LAKE CHAMPLAIN.

The new Permanent Home in Burlington will be Vermont Adaptive's year-round home for adaptive sport programs in the northern part of the state. Approximately 2,000 square feet of total space is needed to meet current demand.

What's Needed in the New Location/Building

- Immediate access to the Burlington Bike Path and the Waterfront
- Parking and accessible bathrooms
- Space that is warm and efficient in the winter while being convertible to inside/outside space to welcome a bigger audience in the summer would be ideal
- To be located near and around other programs, increasing the social and recreational contact between people with disabilities and the able-bodied.

We have many options and are looking at various locations for our permanent home on the Burlington Waterfront. Our hope is to combine our resources with those like the Burlington Parks, Rec and Waterfront, to redevelop the site at Perkins Pier into a multi-use, universally accessible site for Every BODY to enjoy.
